#### THIS WEEK'S GAME

Wofford will open the home portion of the 2009 schedule on Saturday when the Terriers host Charleston Southern at 7:00 pm at Gibbs Stadium ... Wofford is coming off a 40-7 loss at South Florida to open the season, while the Bucs were defeated by top-ranked Florida 62-3... For the contest, the Terriers will be wearing throwback uniforms in honor of the 1949 team that posted an undefeated regular season and played in the Cigar Bowl against Florida State ... Wofford holds an 11-0 lead in the series against the Bucs ... The Terriers have won eight straight home openers, dating back to the 2001 season ... Wofford and Charleston Southern have one common opponent this year in the University of South Florida... The Terriers are ranked fourteenth in the Sports Network Poll and fourteenth in the FCS Coaches Poll ... The Bucs received votes in the Sports Network Preseason Poll ... The game will be available on TerrierVision at [www.woffordterriers.com](http://www.woffordterriers.com).

#### ABOUT WOFFORD

Wofford began the 2009 season with a 40-7 loss at the University of South Florida. Wofford returns 44 letterwinners from last season, including four offensive starters, five defensive starters and three specialists. In addition, three other players with at least two starts return for Wofford. Wofford runs the wingbone offense, led by sophomore quarterback Mitch Allen and backs Mike Rucker, Sean Lees and Eric Breitenstein. Last season the rushing offense was second in the nation with 343.27 yards per game and the total offense of 470.45 yards per game was also second. The offensive line allowed only five sacks in all of 2008, best in the nation. The multiple defense is led by first team All-SoCon defensive lineman Mitch Clark and sophomore linebacker Mike Niam. In 2008 the defense was tenth in the nation with 34 sacks during the season. Wofford had five players named to the Preseason All-SoCon Team. OL Pat Illig and DL Mitch Clark earned first team honors, while OL Trey Johnson, LB Gary Blount, DL Eric Eberhardt and DB Mychael Johnson were named to the second team. The Terriers were picked to finish second in the Southern Conference by the coaches and third by the media in the 2009 Preseason Polls.

#### ABOUT CHARLESTON SOUTHERN

Charleston Southern is 0-1 on the season after a loss to Florida. Head Coach Jay Mills is in his seventh season at CSU and has a 34-34 record at the school and a 37-55 career mark. The Bucs return 37 lettermen and 16 starters from the 2008 season in which the team

posted a 7-5 overall record. They were 3-2 in the Big South to finish second. This season they were picked to finish fifth in the Big South preseason poll. On offense, they are led by A.J. Toscano, a transfer from Cerritos College in California. He threw for 177 yards at Florida. WR Gerald Stevenson, LB Andrew McCain and K John Paglia received preseason All-Big South honors. Charleston Southern began playing football in 1991 and won the Big South Championship in 2005.

### THE CHARLESTON SOUTHERN SERIES

This will be the twelfth meeting between Wofford and Charleston Southern. The series began in 1993 and the Terriers have won all eleven previous games. At Wofford, the Terriers are 8-0, including the last three games in the series. Last season's game was scheduled to be played in Charleston, however the contest was moved to Spartanburg due to a tropical storm. In the 2008 game, Wofford won 41-23.

### AGAINST THE BIG SOUTH

Since joining the Southern Conference in 1997, the Terriers have a 12-1 mark against Big South opponents. Wofford has faced Charleston Southern, Gardner-Webb and Presbyterian among the seven current members of the conference.

### CHARLESTON SOUTHERN LAST WEEK

The defending BCS National Champions and preseason #1 pick Florida Gators showed why they have earned such accolades, taking a 62-3 victory over Charleston Southern in the first game of the season for both programs. Despite putting just three points on the board against the 11 returning starters on the Florida defense, CSU was able to move the ball, gaining 206 yards in the first half, including 170 through the air. Going one play shy of three quarters of the game, A.J. Toscano finished 18-31 through the air for 152 yards with one interception. He also rushed six times, gaining 20 yards. Andrew Trudnowski played the fourth quarter, going 9-17 for 45 yards. Alex Neal was the favorite target, catching seven passes for 45 yards, while Kwame Krakue hauled in six passes for 63 yards. Gerald Stevenson and B.J. Hackworth each carried the ball for a team-best 21 yards.

The CSU offense was able to gain 18 first downs, and 323 total yards against what both Mills and Toscano called one of the best defenses in the nation. CSU also dominated the time of possession, holding the ball for a combined 23:00 in the first and fourth quarters alone, finishing the game with control of the ball for 37:34.

Matt Bach led the defensive unit with five tackles for CSU. Jacques Bazile and Cornelius Sterling each chimed in with four stops, while Antonio Brown had the lone tackle behind the line of scrimmage. Andy Brown finished the game with eight punts for an average of 37.8 yards, while John Paglia averaged 60 yards per kickoff, adding a 38-yard field goal.

### TERRIER-BUCS CONNECTIONS

The Terriers and Bucs have several connections among players. Wofford RB Matthew Boggs and Bucs WR Gerald Stevenson, DB Antwain Harvey and DB Jacques Bazile played at Naples (FL) High School ... Wofford HB Bryan Youman and Bucs LB Chris Patrick played at East Ridge High School (Clermont, FL) ... Wofford has 27 players from the state of South Carolina, while Charleston Southern has 21 from the Palmetto state.

### WOFFORD LAST WEEK

The Terriers were defeated 40-7 by the University of South Florida in the season opener at Raymond James Stadium. The game was tied at 7-7 late in the first half, but two bad snaps on punts, plus two fumbles in the third quarter, turned the tide in favor of the Bulls. The Terriers open the season 0-1, while the Bulls are 1-0. Wofford was led by Eric Breitenstein with 121 yards on 13 carries. Mitch Allen added 54 yards and he was 3-of-9 passing for 27 yards. The Bulls were led by quarterback Matt Grothe with 19-of-23 passing for 155 yards and a touchdown. Mo Plancher had 78 yards with two touchdowns.

### WOFFORD-USF GAME NOTES

The start of the game was delayed for approximately 25 minutes due to a thunderstorm near the stadium during pregame warm-ups ... The game marked the first career start for 14 Wofford players ... The loss ended a streak of five-straight season opener wins for the Terriers ... Ricco Braxton and SeQuan Stanley both recorded their first career sacks in the game ... Tommy Irvin notched his third career interception and recorded his first career fumble recovery ... Mike Niam played every defensive down and led the team with a career-high eleven tackles ... The safety allowed by the Terriers at the end of the second half marked the first safety allowed since October 8, 2005 against Elon.

### TERRIER TOP TEN

Here are the top ten notes of interest heading into the CSU game:

- Eric Breitenstein is first in the SoCon and fifteenth in the nation with 121 rushing yards
- Wofford has won eleven straight against Charleston Southern
- Fourteen players made their first career starts at South Florida
- The offensive line allowed only five sacks in 2008, best in the NCAA FCS
- Wofford had five players named Preseason All-SoCon
- Mitch Clark led the team with eight sacks in 2008, eighth most in school history in a season
- The nine wins by Wofford in 2008 were tied for fourth-most in school history
- Wofford will be wearing 1949 throwback jerseys for the CSU game
- The Terriers had the nation's second-best rushing offense at 343.27 ypg in 2008
- Wofford had over 400 yards of offense in all but one game in 2008 (South Carolina)

### HEAD COACH MIKE AYERS

Wofford head coach Mike Ayers (Georgetown, Ky. '74), the winningest coach in school history, is entering his 22nd season at the Terrier helm with a record of 142-96-1. Ayers is in his 25th year as a collegiate head coach and has a record of 152-119-2 that includes a three-year stint as the head coach at East Tennessee State from 1985-87. Ayers has earned Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors from the league coaches in 2000, 2003 and 2007 and by the media in 2000, '02 and '03. Ayers was the 2003 recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award as Division I-AA's National Coach of the Year and also earned the 2002 Division I-AA National Coach of the Year award from the *College Sporting News* in addition to being the runner-up for the Robinson Award.

### INJURY UPDATE

Wofford opened the season without running back Jeremy Marshall, who is still recovering from a knee injury suffered in the 2008 Appalachian State game. Freshmen Cody Burris (clavicle) and Kenny Barnes (knee) will also miss the season after injuries in August camp. DL Mitch Clark, WR Justice Joslin and LB Cody Van Der Linden were out of the USF game due to injury. There were no significant injuries at USF.

### SEASON OPENERS

Wofford is 46-54-1 all-time in season openers since posting a 5-1 win over Furman on December 14, 1889 ... Under head coach Mike Ayers, the Terriers are 12-10 in season openers ... The loss at USF ended a streak of winning five straight season openers (38-21 over Presbyterian in 2008, 38-21 over Georgetown in 2007, 28-21 over South Carolina State in 2006, 34-24 over Georgetown in 2005, 24-22 over South Carolina State in 2004) ... When Wofford opens the season at home, its record is 24-20-1.

### HOME OPENERS

Wofford has won the last eight home openers. The last home opening loss came in 2000 when the Terriers lost 34-14 to Lehigh on September 9. With Mike Ayers at the helm, Wofford is 13-8 in home openers.

### WOFFORD IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Just one week into the regular season, several Terriers are listed in the national rankings. Eric Breitenstein is 15th in the nation with a 121.0 rushing average. Tommy Irvin is tied for eighth in the nation with one interception. Mike Rucker is tied for 26th with a 26.0 kickoff return average. Ricco Braxton and SeQuan Stanley are tied for 15th with one sack. Mike Niam is tied for 26th in

the nation with 11 tackles.

### **THE TERRIERS IN THE CONFERENCE RANKINGS**

Wofford is ranked in several key categories in the conference statistics as well. Wofford is second in kickoff returns and third in rushing offense, sacks and tackles for loss. In the top fifteen conference rushers, Wofford has Eric Breitenstein (1), Mitch Allen (7) and Stev Davitte (13). Breitenstein is sixth in total offense, followed by Mitch Allen at 12. Tommy Irvin is tied for second in interceptions, while Ricco Braxton and SeQuan Stanley are tied for second in sacks. Mike Niam is tied for sixth in tackles. Mike Rucker leads the conference in kickoff return yards, while Stephon Shelton is sixth.

### **PRESEASON ALL-SOUTHERN CONFERENCE**

The Terriers were well represented on the Southern Conference Preseason Team as determined by the league's coaches. DL Mitch Clark and OL Pat Illig were named to the first team. OL Trey Johnson, DL Eric Eberhardt, LB Gary Blount and DB Mychael Johnson received second team honors.

### **PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL**

In the 2009 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, defending conference champion Appalachian State was picked to finish first by the coaches and media. Wofford was picked second by the coaches and third by the media. Elon was picked second by the media and third by the coaches.

### **TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS**

The 2009 season marks the ninth time in the last ten seasons the Terriers have played against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A) and is the second time Wofford has played two FBS teams in the same season. Last year, Wofford defeated 23-13 by South Carolina on September 20. In 2007, Wofford was defeated 38-17 at NC State after several turnovers hurt the Terriers chances ... In 2006, Wofford lost 27-20 at South Carolina as the Terriers brought the score within one touchdown with 4:42 on the clock and then drove to the Gamecock 10-yard line ... Recently the Terriers have also played West Virginia (2005), Air Force (2003), Maryland (2002), Clemson (2001), South Carolina (2001) and Louisiana Monroe (2000) ... Wofford has schools such as Ohio (9-4-10), South Carolina and Clemson on future schedules.

### **THROWBACK TIME**

For the Charleston Southern game, the Terriers will be wearing throwback jerseys to mark the 60th anniversary of the 1949 team that was undefeated in the regular season and played in the Cigar Bowl against Florida State. The 1949 Terriers marched through the regular season undefeated, 11-0, and played in the Cigar Bowl held in Tampa, Florida on January 2, 1950.

The jerseys are black with block gold numerals. There is also a commemorative patch on the left chest marking the 1949 season. The helmets will feature a black stripe down the middle and the year 1949 front and center of the helmet. Aside from the obvious changes to the helmet, the jerseys will not feature nameplates on the back of the jerseys in keeping with the throwback look.

The jerseys will be worn in game action only once, however members of the 1949 team and their families have been invited to join a special on-field recognition at halftime of the Homecoming game on October 3 vs. Georgia Southern. At that time, members of the 1949 team will wear the jerseys as part of their recognition.

The jerseys will then make their way to The Terrier Ball that evening and be auctioned as part of a fundraiser with all proceeds going to the Phil Dickens Scholarship Fund. Coach Dickens was 40-16-7 in six seasons at Wofford from 1947-52.

### **SC COACH STEVE SPURRIER ON WOFFORD IN 2008**

"Wofford played tough. I really admire the way that those guys play. Coach Ayers never has to worry about the effort level of those kids. They all play their hearts out every play. It is fun to watch them play to tell you the truth. We are trying to get to that level. We are trying to play like Wofford around here. If we can do that, we are going to have a chance."

### **RETURNING ALL-CONFERENCE**

While Wofford has lost some key players from 2008, they also return twoplayers who earned All-Southern Conference honors last season. DL Mitch Clark was first team all-conference, while DB Mychael Johnson earned second team all-conference honors.

### **SUMMER TIME**

Over 50 Terriers were back on campus this summer for class and the off-season conditioning program. In addition, several players had interesting summers. Trey Johnson hiked to the top of Snowmass Mountain in Colorado ... Mitch Clark interned at General Electric in Cincinnati ... Mitch Clark interned in corporate finance at Hospice ... Eric Breitenstein worked at adidas ... Jordan Ingman worked at his father's marina in Florida ... Carter Stinman was a rafting guide at the US National Whitewater Center ... Hunter Hobson painted houses in Jackson Hole, Wyoming.

### **STRICKLAND IN THE NFL**

Wide receiver Andy Strickland graduated from Wofford in May with a degree in finance, but his education on the football field continued. He signed as a rookie free agent with the Jacksonville Jaguars and caught two passes in the first preseason game, plus a 16-yard catch against Tampa Bay. He was released on August 24. Strickland led the Terriers in receiving for three seasons and is finished his Wofford career eighth in all-time receptions, fifth all-time in receiving yards and third in career touchdown receptions. He was the Wofford first player in an NFL training camp since 2004.

### **THE 2009 SCHEDULE**

The Terriers have a difficult schedule in front of them in 2009. After the opener at South Florida, who defeated Memphis 41-14 in the St. Petersburg Bowl, Wofford will host Charleston Southern. A trip to Wisconsin on September 19 will be followed by the first conference game at Chattanooga. Wofford will host Georgia Southern on October 3 for homecoming. The Terriers will host Appalachian State, Elon and Samford and travel to Western Carolina, The Citadel and Furman in SoCon play.

### **SWITCHING POSITIONS**

Several players have switched positions in preparation for the 2009 season. Clark Gaston joined Wofford as a defensive lineman, but moved to tight end. Brad Miller moved from linebacker to tight end. Bryan Youman was a cornerback, but has moved to halfback. Cody Van Der Linden has moved from defensive line to linebacker. Once fall practice began, Stev Davitte added work at quarterback in addition to wide receiver, Thomas Simmons moved from receiver to halfback and Mychael Johnson moved to safety from cornerback. Last week, Trey Diller moved from safety to wide receiver.

### **SWITCHING NUMBERS**

Since the media guide was printed, several players have changed numbers in order to reduce the number of duplicate jerseys on the field. Chris White has moved to 5, Josh Wright is now 92, and James Lane is 59.

### **DEAN OF SOUTH CAROLINA COACHES**

Head coach Mike Ayers is entering his 22nd season at Wofford, the longest-serving coach at the Division I level in South Carolina. With 142 wins at Wofford, he is also the winningest coach among the coaches at their current schools.

### **THE 2008 TRUE FRESHMAN IMPACT**

During the 2008 season, several true freshmen made an impact. On the defensive line, Alex Goltry, Ameet Pall and Eric Eberhardt all played extensively and all recorded at least 3.5 tackles for loss. Alex Goltry had an interception against Western Carolina. Eric Breitenstein has 59 carries for 395 yards and two touchdowns. Receiver Brenton Bersin made 4 catches for 63 yards. Punter Craig Novack averaged 36.3 yards. Carter Stinman was the kickoff specialist, averaging 57.9 yards. Kendall Bratcher had 39 tackles and an interception, while Mike Niam added 54 tackles and an interception. Special teams was a strong point for the rookie class, with Michael Roulhac, Brad Nocek, and Trey Diller all making tackles.

### **NEW FACES ON THE DEPTH CHART**

With the start of the season, the Wofford depth chart has several new faces that were not on the two-deep following spring practice. The area where this is most noticable is in the secondary, with freshmen Rob Williams, Stephon Shelton and Blake Wylie on the two deep. At linebacker, freshmen SeQuan Stanley and Phillip LeGrande are listed at inside and outside linebacker, respectively.

## FIRST CAREER STARTS

Against the University of South Florida, the Terriers had 14 different players record their first career start. On offense, Mitch Allen, Matt Vick, Ben Wilmoth, Clark Bishop, Brenton Bersin and Devin Reed started for the first time. Jordan Ingman, SeQuan Stanley, Ameet Pall, Keaton Thompson, Eric Eberhardt, Alex Goltry, Mike Niam and Kendall Bratcher recorded their first career starts on defense.

## OTHER FIRSTS

Against the University of South Florida, Ricco Braxton and SeQuan Stanley had their first career sacks ... Also against USF, Tommy Irvin had his first fumble recovery, Montae Monroe had his first catch, Chris Tommie made his first PAT and Stephon Shelton had his first kickoff return.

## WHAT A DIFFERENCE IN A YEAR

When the Terriers lined up against South Florida on September 5, only three players started who also started the 2008 season opener against Presbyterian. On defense, only Mychael Johnson returned to the starting line-up, however he was at safety instead of cornerback. On offense, center Trey Johnson and guard Pat Illig were back.

## FOURTH DOWN? GO FOR IT!

Wofford went for it on fourth down 39 times last season, the second most in the FCS. Central Connecticut State went for it on fourth down 36 times to lead the nation. However Wofford was successful 25 times, which led the nation. The 64% success rate was only 14th in the nation however. Against Samford, Wofford converted 5-of-9 fourth down attempts. This also leads to the fact that Wofford punted only 28 times last season, which was the lowest number in the nation. San Diego was the next-lowest with 31 punts this season.

## THE RED ZONE

The Terriers numbers inside the red zone last season were somewhat deceiving. Wofford was 41 of 54 inside the 20 yard line last season for a 75.9% success rate. The 54 trips in the red zone were tied for the fourth most in the nation. South Dakota State made 63 trips, Richmond and Tennessee State made 56 trips, while Wofford tied at 54 with Montana. However, of the 13 unsuccessful trips, three were at the end of the half and an additional three were late in the fourth quarter when Wofford had the game in hand. There were also two missed field goals and an incomplete fake field goal in the red zone.

## GOING OVERTIME

The overtime game on September 27 at Georgia Southern was only the fourth overtime game in school history. The Terriers lost the first two overtime games. On October 19, 2002, Wofford defeated Western Carolina 31-24. With the 38-37 win at Georgia Southern, Wofford is now 2-2 all-time in overtime games.

## PUTTING UP SOME POINTS

In the three-game stretch against Chattanooga, Western Carolina and Elon, Wofford scored 56, 42 and 55 points for a total of 153 points. The last time Wofford had 150+ points in a three-game window was in the 1989 season when Wofford had 51, 45 and 55 points over Davidson, Kentucky State and West Virginia Tech. Overall, the Terriers were seventh in the nation in scoring offense with an average of 36.64 points per game. Wofford put up at least 38 points in six of the eight

wins on the season.

## QUICK STRIKES

For an offense that is not known for explosive plays, the Terriers wasted little time on drives last season. In 23 of 62 scoring drives, Wofford scored in five or fewer plays. Big plays were a part of that success, with a total of 23 touchdowns coming on plays of 20 or more yards. In 2007, Wofford only had 12 touchdowns of 20 or more yards in the 13 games.

## THE QUARTERBACK

Senior Ben Widmyer left big shoes to fill after a 2008 season in which he rushed for 800 yards with 10 touchdowns. Plus, he threw for ten touchdowns on 77-of-118 passing to set school records for completion percentage and passing efficiency. Sophomore Mitch Allen will be taking the helm this season. In 2008, he played in ten games and completed 13-of-22 passes and also rushed for 404 yards on 48 carries with three touchdowns. He will be backed up by senior wide receiver turned quarterback Stev Davitte, second-year freshman Chris White and true freshman Brian Kass.

## CLARK MAKES THE SACK

Senior defensive end Mitch Clark was busy making tackles behind the line of scrimmage last season. He was second in the Southern Conference with 8.0 sacks for a loss of 60 yards. The 0.73 sack per game average was tied for 20th in the nation. The eight sacks in a season is eighth all-time at Wofford. In addition, he had 12.0 tackles for loss, which is third in the Southern Conference. He earned All-SoCon first team honors following the season and also is a Preseason All-SoCon first-team honoree in 2009.

## POLL POSITION

With the opening of the 2009 season, the Terriers are beginning pretty much in the same place where they finished in 2008. In the final 2008 Sports Network FCS Poll, Wofford was eighth and in the FCS Coaches Poll the Terriers were ninth. In 2009, Wofford began the season tenth in both polls, but dropped four spots after the first game.

## WINNING SEASONS

Wofford's 9-3 record in 2008 gave the Terriers a winning season for the seventh straight season year. Over the past twenty-one seasons under Coach Ayers, Wofford has recorded 15 winning seasons.

## WOFFORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS

Since 2000, Wofford is 16-1 in non-conference regular season FCS games ... Wofford's loss to Coastal Carolina in 2006 snapped a streak of 10 straight regular season non-conference wins against FCS opponents ... The Terriers had not lost a non-conference regular season game to a FCS opponent since dropping the 2000 season opener to Lehigh 34-14 ... In 2000 and 2001, the Terriers defeated Charleston Southern ... In 2002, Wofford had non-league wins over South Carolina State and Elon ... In 2003 and 2004, the Terriers defeated South Carolina State while also adding a win over Gardner-Webb in '04 ... In 2005, Wofford defeated VMI and Gardner-Webb ... The Terriers opened the 2006 campaign with a 28-21 win over South Carolina State and ended the season with a non-conference win over Gardner-Webb. In 2007, Wofford went 3-0 with regular season non-conference wins over Georgetown, Charleston Southern, and Gardner-Webb. In the 2008 season, the Terriers opened with wins over Presbyterian and Charleston Southern for a 2-0 record.

## TERRIERS AT HOME

Wofford has won 32 of its last 39 games played in Gibbs Stadium ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 52-19 (.732) ... Under Mike Ayers, Wofford is 61-33 (.649) in home games ... The Terriers have won 30 of 44 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium ... The home crowd was exceptional last season, with two of the top five all-time crowds in 2007 ... The Georgia Southern game was witnessed by a school-record 12,124 fans, while the Appalachian State game had 11,042 fans, fifth most in school history.

## FACING NUMBER ONE

When Wofford faced Appalachian State on September 22, it marked only the third time that the Terriers have faced a team at the top of the polls. In 1999, Wofford lost 55-14 at Gibbs Stadium to top-ranked Georgia Southern. In 2003, Wofford lost 24-9 to Delaware in the NCAA Playoffs. With the 42-31 win on September 22, it marked the first time Wofford had defeated a top-ranked team. When the Terriers played at James Madison on November 29, it was the fourth time facing the #1 team.

## TERRIERS ON TV

The Terriers will be making at least four appearances on television this season, with three games airing on FSN SportSouth and one game on the Big Ten Network.

Wofford will make three appearances regionally on FSN SportSouth as part of the "SoCon Saturday" package. The Terriers will host Appalachian State for a televised game, while the road games at Furman and The Citadel also will be broadcast.

In addition, the road game at Wisconsin will air on the Big Ten Network. The contest will be available on many cable and satellite providers, including DirecTV. The USF game was available on ESPN GamePlan as a pay-per-view option and on ESPN360.com.

## COMING BACK IN 2009

Overall the Terriers are looking to return nine starters in 2009, plus three specialists. Mychael Johnson and Mitch Clark are the returning players who garnered All-SoCon honors in 2008. Joining Johnson and Clark on defense will be LB Gary Blount, SS Tommy Irvin and CB Preston Roseboro. On offense, OL Pat Illig, C Trey Johnson, HB Mike Rucker and WR Justice Joslin return. Specialists returning include long snapper Chris Cummings, kickoff specialist Carter Stinman and punter Craig Novack. In addition, returners FB Eric Breitenstein and WR Stev Davitte have started two or more games each. Also, P Chris Tommie will return after missing the 2008 season due to injury.

## 2009 RECRUITING CLASS

Wofford welcomed a total of 20 student-athletes in the 2009 recruiting class. The Terriers freshmen include 13 players on defense, six players on offense and a specialist. The student-athletes are from seven different states, including seven from South Carolina and three from North Carolina. In addition, six walk-ons joined the team in September.

## RELOADING THE LINE

The offensive line will have plenty of new faces as three starters graduated in 2008. Returning will be Trey Johnson at center and Pat Illig at left guard. Tentative new starters will be Matt Vick at left tackle, Ben Wilmoth at right guard, and Clark Bishop at right tackle. The line will be somewhat smaller in size, with only one player on the two-deep listed at over 300 pounds.

## BACK IN THE BACKFIELD

In the offensive backfield, the Terriers will be without Dane Romero, who was second in the nation with 138 points last season. Wofford returns junior Mike Rucker, who had 75 carries for 539 yards and four touchdowns. Also returning is sophomore Eric Breitenstein with 59 carries and 395 yards with two touchdowns at fullback. Sean Lees and Matt Boggs missed almost all of last season due to knee injuries, but both will return this season. Other backs returning with carries from 2008 are Michael Scott, Derek Boyce, Arsenio Parks, Austin Palmer, and Brad Nocek. Players who did not play last year include Lavadrick Farrar and Alex Dunmire.

## LOOKING AT LINEBACKERS

Another position group that took a hit due to graduation was linebacker. The Terriers lost multiple All-SoCon honoree Seth Goldwire along with Matt Norcia and James Mitchell. Senior Gary Blount is the only true veteran to return to the unit with eleven starts and he is the top returning tackler on the team. Joining him on the outside will be second-year freshman Ricco Braxton, with junior Keaton Thompson backing up both players. At inside linebacker, sophomores Jonathon Sharpe and Mike Niam will hold down the middle. Niam was named the team's defensive freshman of the year and finished fifth on the team in tackles.

## DEEP IN THE SECONDARY

The one area on the depth chart that has perhaps the most new faces is the defensive secondary. Mychael Johnson is the only senior starter, however he has moved from corner to free safety. Junior Tommy Irvin starts at strong safety. Starters at cornerback are sophomore Kendall Bratcher and freshman Stephon Shelton, while freshman Blake Wylie and sophomore Jordan Ingman and Preston Roseboro are also on the two-deep. True freshman Rob Williams is a back-up at strong safety, while sophomore Coleman Hornaday is the back-up at free safety.

## ROAD WARRIORS

Over the past three seasons, the Terriers have become road warriors with great success. Last season, Wofford was 5-1 on the road, with the one loss to NC State. In conference play, the Terriers won all four road games in 2007. In 2006, Wofford was 3-2 on the road, 2-1 in conference. In 2008, the Terriers were 3-3 on the road. Overall, Wofford had won eight straight SoCon road games dating back to a 35-21 win at Elon on October 21, 2006 before the loss at Appalachian State on October 31.

## HOME COOKING

The Terriers were an impressive 6-0 at Gibbs Stadium last season. The last time Wofford was undefeated at home was in the 2003 season with a 6-0 regular season mark, plus 2-0 in the postseason.

## DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense received contributions from numerous players in 2008. Nineteen players had 20+ tackles on the season, while fifteen different players have sacks. Eleven different players had intercepted a pass this season and fifteen players had a pass break-up. Twenty players recorded a tackle for loss.

## PREVENTING THE SACK

At the end of the season, the offensive line only allowed five sacks - at South Carolina to the nation's fourth ranked defense in the FBS and at Appalachian State, Samford and James Madison. In 2007, the team allowed only 14 sacks in the 13 games played. Air Force led all of NCAA Division I with just three sacks in 2008.

## DROPPING THE QB

While the offensive line was preventing sacks, the defensive line made them with 34 on the season for a loss of 213 yards. Against Georgia Southern, Wofford had a season-high six sacks. The Terriers were tenth in the nation in sacks per game. The Terriers had at least one sack in all but the NCAA Playoff game at James Madison.

## ABOUT THE TURNOVERS

Wofford was second in the Southern Conference and 14th in the nation with a +0.92 turnover margin per game. The Terriers turned the ball over only eleven times in twelve games, four interceptions and seven fumbles. On the other side, Wofford gained 22 turnovers - thirteen interceptions and nine fumble recoveries.

## THE 2008 TERRIERS GROUND ATTACK

At the end of the 2008 season, the Wofford rushing offense was second in the nation with an average of 343.27 yards per game rushing. In all of NCAA Division I, Wofford is second in rushing offense. The top FBS team is Navy at 298.33 yards per game, followed by Nevada at 291.45 yards. Wofford was also second in the nation in rushing offense in 2007.

## TOTAL OFFENSE

At the end of the 2008 regular season, the Wofford total offense was second in the nation. With an average of 467.17 yards per game, the Terriers were behind Cal Poly. Wofford gained 500 or more yards in a game four times this season and in all but the South Carolina game the Terriers had over 400 yards of offense.

## SPREADING AROUND THE CARRIES

The Terriers spread around the carries last season, with 18 different players taking at least one carry. Against Western Carolina, a total of 13 different Terriers had carries. In addition, Wofford had five different players reach the 100+ rushing mark a total of twelve times. Ben Widmyer (2), Dane Romero (5), Mitch Allen, Eric Breitenstein and Mike Rucker (3) all accomplished the feat. In 2007, three players had a total of seven 100+ games.

## ALL-PURPOSE RUCKER

Junior running back Mike Rucker made his mark in 2008 primarily on kickoff returns. His 42 kickoff returns were the most in a single season at Wofford, while his 931 kickoff return yards also were

the most in school history. He was fifth in the Southern Conference in kickoff returns and 68th in the nation. He is sixth on the career list in kickoff returns and fourth on the all-time list in kickoff return yardage with 1516 yards. His 23.2 career average is fourth in school history.

### **WOFFORD 2008 SEASON RECAP**

Wofford ended the season 9-3 overall, including a second-place finish in the Southern Conference and a trip to the NCAA FCS Playoffs for the second-straight season. It was the third time in the last six years that the Terriers made an appearance in the playoffs. Wofford was defeated 38-35 by top-ranked James Madison in the playoffs. The Dukes advanced to the semifinals, where they lost to Montana. Wofford had wins over Presbyterian, Charleston Southern, Georgia Southern, Chattanooga, Western Carolina, Elon, The Citadel, Samford and Furman. Losses were to South Carolina, Appalachian State and James Madison. The Terriers had a 7-1 record in the Southern Conference, the second-best conference record in school history. After the season, Wofford had the nation's second-ranked rushing offense at 339.75 yards per game and the second ranked total offense in the nation with 467.17 average yards. The scoring offense was sixth in the nation, while the passing efficiency ranked first in the country. The defense was tenth in the nation in sacks, while the offense led the nation in fewest sacks allowed. The turnover margin of +.92 was 14th in the nation. In the Sports Network Poll the Terriers finished eighth, and in the FCS Coaches Poll the Terriers finished ranked eleventh.

### **2008 TEAM RECORDS**

The Terriers set new school records in several categories in the 2008 season. The 5,606 yards of total offense broke the record of 5,559 yards set last season. The 145 completed passes tied the school record with the mark set in 1986. In addition, the 4,077 rushing yards and 438 points scored were the second-most in school history.

### **ALUMNI COACHES**

With the addition of Aaron Johnson to the coaching staff in 2008, Wofford now has six assistant coaches who graduated from Wofford College. The group includes Nathan Fuqua '03, Aaron Johnson '06, Wade Lang '83, Eric Nash '02, Shiel Wood '06 and Nate Woody '84. Nathan Fuqua is also the newest member of the Wofford Athletics Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2008.

### **RECENT SUCCESS**

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in six of the last seven years, winning two SoCon Championships. The Terriers have won 38 of their last 52 conference games over the past seven seasons. Over that time, Wofford is the second-winningest program in the Southern Conference trailing only two-time national champion Appalachian State.

### **ACADEMIC SUCCESS**

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) in four of the last five seasons to earn public recognition. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 60 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003. Wofford has had three players named CoSIDA/ESPN *The Magazine* First Team All-District in the last two seasons. When the NCAA released Graduation Success Rates in October, the Wofford football team led the conference with a score of 97.

### **ABOUT WOFFORD**

Wofford is currently the fourth-smallest school in NCAA Division I with an enrollment of 1,400 students. The smallest school is Centenary with 1,017, followed by Presbyterian College at 1,200 and VMI with 1,300. Wofford College, established in 1854, is an independent liberal arts college in Spartanburg, S.C. (average SAT for incoming class, 1247). Wofford ranks in the top five nationally in the percentage of undergraduates receiving credit for study abroad. Home to one of the nation's 276 Phi Beta Kappa chapters, Wofford's historic 170-acre campus is recognized as a national arboretum. Affiliated with the United Methodist Church, the college is committed to quintessential undergraduate education within the context of values-based inquiry.

TAMPA, Fla. – Wofford was defeated 40-7 by the University of South Florida in the season opener at Raymond James Stadium. The game was tied at 7-7 late in the first half, but two bad snaps on punts, plus two fumbles in the third quarter, turned the tide in favor of the Bulls.

The Bulls took the opening kickoff and put together a twelve-play drive that went 65 yards. Mo Plancher took the ball in from four-yards out for the touchdown at 9:46 and a 7-0 lead. Wofford was able to respond with a 13-play drive that took 6:46 off the clock and went 69 yards. The Terriers picked up five first downs on the drive that ended with a two-yard touchdown run by Eric Breitenstein that tied the game at 7-7 at the 3:00 mark of the first half.

USF turned the ball over in the second quarter as Mike Niam forced Aston Samuels to fumble and it was recovered by Tommy Irvin. The Terriers attempted a 38-yard field goal at the 6:55 mark, but the kick was just wide left.

With the ball back, Bulls quarterback Matt Grothe was intercepted by Tommy Irvin in the endzone to end the drive. The Terriers went three-and-out on the next drive. On the punt, the snap was high and Chris Tommie was taken down at the eight-yard line. Matt Grothe found Theo Wilson in the endzone for a six-yard touchdown reception and the Bulls took a 14-7 lead with 36 seconds left in the first half. Wofford gained one first down on the final drive of the half before being forced to punt. The snap was high again and the ball was kicked out the back of the endzone for a safety with just one second left on the clock for a 16-7 lead.

In the second half, Mo Plancher scored on a nine-yard touchdown run to take a 23-7 lead at the 10:47 mark in the third quarter. On the next possession for the Terriers, Stev Davitte fumbled on the second play of the drive after a gain of 18 yards. The Bulls were able to convert the turnover into three points as Delbert Alvarado hit a 30-yard field goal with 5:57 on the clock in the third quarter for a 26-7 lead.

Wofford then had a 44-yard gain by Eric Breitenstein up the middle, but Jerome Murphy came from behind and forced a fumble that was recovered on the sideline by Tyson Butler in the third quarter. Lindsey Lamer scored on a 13-yard run at the 8:18 mark of the fourth quarter to take a 33-7 lead. After Wofford went three-and-out, the Bulls answered with a 22-yard touchdown pass from B.J. Daniels to Jeffrey Wilson with 5:06 left in the game for the 40-7 final score.
