BIG SOUTH GETS BIGGER IN 2009

The Big South football membership is at seven members in 2009, including six Division I programs for the second-straight year. Presbyterian College, which is in the final two years of its transition to Division I, is now considered an official Conference opponent in the Big South this year, and the Blue Hose will count in the standings. The addition gives the Big South a six-game Conference schedule for the first time in League history. However, PC will not be eligible for the Big South football championship until it becomes a full-fledged member of NCAA Division I in 2011.

PRESEASON PLAUDITS

Six of the seven Big South football teams received votes in *The Sports Network* Preseason Top 25 poll, a Conference record for most teams receiving Top 25 votes in the same poll at any time during the season. With a record 160 ballots cast, **Liberty** (330), **Coastal Carolina** (52), **Charleston Southern** (12), **Stony Brook** (10), **Presbyterian** (2) and **Gardner-Webb** (1) each received at least one Top 25 vote, and Liberty finished just outside the Top 25 at No. 27. In the FCS Coaches Preseason Poll, Liberty was No. 26.

THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS TO THE BIG SOUTH'S AUTOMATIC BID IN 2010

The Big South Conference is just one year away from receiving an automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. As part of the NCAA's expansion of the FCS Playoffs to 20 teams beginning in 2010, the Big South was granted an automatic bid to the playoffs that same year. The Big South's six Division I playing members are eligible to receive an at-large playoff berth in 2009.

BIG SOUTH KICKS OFF EIGHTH SEASON THIS WEEK

The Big South begins Year Eight of its young football history this week with all teams in action. It will be the second consecutive year that the League will open on a Thursday night (Coastal Carolina at Kent State) and third time overall. Big South teams are a combined 19-17 in season openers since 2002, including a League-best four wins in 2005 and 2006. Liberty owns the best season opening record in the Big South's football history, going 5-2 in the first game since 2002. The Flames have won their last five season openers. Meanwhile, VMI has won its last four openers, including shutouts in 2005, 2007 and 2008.

TEAM-BY-TEAM OPENERS

Charleston Southern is opening the campaign on the road for the seventh-straight season. Coastal Carolina is opening on the road for the fifth time overall and the fifth time in the last six years, and will open the season against an FBS opponent for the second year-in-a-row. Gardner-Webb is opening at home for the first time since 2005, while Liberty is opening on the road for the first time since 2003. Stony Brook opens the slate on the road for the first time under fourth-year head coach **CHUCK PRIORE** and the first time since 2004. VMI, which is playing its 119th season, will open at home for the fifth-straight year. Below is a team-by-team look at season openers:

LIBERTY PICKED TO REPEAT AGAIN IN 2009

Fresh off its second consecutive Big South football championship in 2008, the Liberty Flames are the preseason Big South favorite, as voted by the League's head coaches and media panel. It is the third-straight year that the Flames have been tabbed the Conference's preseason football favorite. However, in the annual preseason poll, a record five teams received at least one first-place vote, indicating that this year's race will be tightly contested.

ELEVEN IS HEAVEN

Liberty enters the 2009 season with its Big South-record 11-game Conference win streak intact. During the current run, the Flames have scored at least 30 points in each game and is averaging 40.8 points, while holding their League brethren to 17.6 points. Liberty has won five of those 11 games on the road. Liberty also has won six consecutive home Big South games, a streak that began Nov. 11, 2006.

A RARE SWEEP

The Big South is the only Conference in the country that will play the reigning national champions in both NCAA Division I Football Subdivisions. On the Big South's football schedule this season are the 2008 FBS national champion Florida Gators (vs. Charleston Southern) and 2008 FCS national champion Richmond Spiders (vs. VMI).

BIG SOUTH PRESEASON OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR - TIM MAYPRAY

VMI senior quarterback **TIM MAYPRAY** has been voted the Big South's 2009 Preseason Offensive Player of the Year. Maypray is the first Keydet player to be voted Big South Preseason Offensive Player of the Year since VMI joined the Big South in 2003. He is the only player in Big South football history with 1,000 rushing and receiving yards in a career, and needs 343 yards to break the Big South's career record for all-purpose yards. **SEAN MIZZER** (VMI, 2003-06) holds the mark of 4,621.

BIG SOUTH PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR - JEFFERY WILLIAMS

Gardner-Webb junior linebacker **JEFFERY WILLIAMS** has been voted the Big South's 2009 Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. He is the fourth Gardner-Webb player to earn the preseason honor, joining **MARIO WILLIAMS** (2003, 2004), **BRIAN JOHNSTON** (2007) and **MARIO BROWN** (2008). In two seasons, Williams has 239 career stops in 22 career games (10.9 per game), and needs 61 tackles to become just the seventh player in Big South history with 300 career tackles.

ANYONE FEEL A DRAFT?

For the third consecutive year, the Big South Conference had a player selected in the NFL Draft, as former Liberty running back **RASHAD JENNINGS** was drafted in the seventh round by the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2009.

FB-YES

The Big South is playing a League-record eight games against FBS opponents in 2009. The previous high was five, just last year. Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Gardner-Webb each are playing two FBS foes this season. The Big South has come close to knocking off one of the big boys in recent seasons -- Gardner-Webb lost to Georgia Tech by three points last year (10-7), while Liberty was edged by Toledo by one point in 2007 (35-34).

WIN STREAKS

In addition to Liberty's 11-game Conference win streak, Charleston Southern carries a five-game home winning streak into the season, the longest active streak in the Big South. It is tied for the fourth-longest in Big South history. The Buccaneers first home game of the season is Sept. 26 vs. North Greenville. Charleston Southern also carries the Big South's longest overall win streak into the season at four games.

MORE ON MAYPRAY

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** is sixth all-time in Big South history with 28 career touchdowns, and needs two scores to become the fifth player with 30. The Conference record is 47 career touchdowns, set by Coastal Carolina's **AUNDRES PERKINS** from 2003-06. Maypray is the only player with at least 10 rushing and 10 receiving touchdowns. Meanwhile, Maypray needs 32 points to become the seventh player in League history with 200 career points scored.

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN SNAPS CHANTICLEERS' SCORING STREAK RECORD

Coastal Carolina's Big South-record 67-game scoring streak came to an end in the 2008 season finale against Charleston Southern. The Chanticleers had scored a point in every game in its history prior to being shut out by the Bucs. VMI takes over the active streak, as the Keydets have scored a point in their last 49 games -- the longest run in the history of the program. Meanwhile, Liberty's current streak stands at 39 games, while Presbyterian has not been shutout in its last 30 games.

2,000 YARDS IN THEIR SIGHTS

VMI's **TIM MAYPRAY** enters the 2009 season needing 63 yards to become the seventh player in Big South football history with 2,000 career rushing yards. He is currently eighth all-time with 1,937. Teammate **HOWARD ABEGESAH** is 104 rushing yards away from the 2,000-yard milestone. Three additional players are within reach of the 2,000 rushing yard milestone. Stony Brook sophomore **EDWIN GOWINS** is 18th in League history with 1,310 rushing yards, a total he set his freshman season a year ago. Teammate **CONTE CUTTINO** is 20th in Big South annals with 1,195 yards, his total from his first year in the Big South in 2008. Gardner-Webb's **PHILIP PEOPLES** ranks 24th in Big South history with 1,093 rushing yards in his career.

BENNETT APPROACHING COACHING MILESTONE

Coastal Carolina head coach **DAVID BENNETT** is five wins away from 50 victories as the Chanticleers' head coach.

HONEST ABE

VMI's **HOWARD ABEGESAH**'s next 100-yard rushing game will be the 10th of his career, which would make him just the fourth player in Big South history with at least 10 career 100-yard rushing games.
