HEAD COACH BARCLAY RADEBAUGH



EAST TENNESSEE STATE '87

5th SEASON at CSU • 6th OVERALL AS HEAD COACH

Barclay Radebaugh enters his fifth season as head men's basketball coach at Charleston Southern. In his first season at CSU, he led the Bucs to a 13-16 overall record, taking them to the Big South Conference semifinals. The Buccaneers also beat the College of Charleston for the first time since 1988, and captured the City Championship for the first time since 1986 with a victory over The Citadel. The Bucs followed this performance with a second consecutive City Championship in 2006. Big home victories over High Point, Liberty and Coastal Carolina highlighted his third season at the helm. The Buccaneers also set a Big South record with 10 Freshman of the Week honors, capped off by Omar Carter earning Big South Freshman of the Year. Under the direction of Radebaugh, Jamarco Warren had a breakout sophomore campaign during the 2008-09 season, breaking the CSU single season record for three pointers made with 99. Another outstanding recruiting class this year has added six new players to a talented bunch of returners.

Radebaugh has an impressive coaching resume from a career that began in 1986 as a student assistant coach at East Tennessee State under Les Robinson. After stops at Wofford and Furman, Radebaugh began a seven-year stay at South Carolina.

While at South Carolina, the Gamecocks won the SEC regular season title and received a number two seed in the 1997 NCAA tournament. In 1998, the Gamecocks finished the season ranked 14th and received a number three seed in the NCAA tournament. At South Carolina, Radebaugh was the position coach for USC's all-time leading scorer B.J. McKie all-time three-point scorer Jamel Bradley.

Radebaugh continued his success as an assistant at Winthrop University, helping the Eagles to back-to-back Big South Conference titles and an NCAA tournament berth in 2002.

Radebaugh then spent one season as the head coach at Queens University in Charlotte, guiding the Royals to a 21-8 record overall and a 14-4 record in the Carolinas-Virginia Athletic Conference. There, Radebaugh coached Spencer Ross, who was named the Sporting News Division II National Player of the Year. Ross was the only Division II player in the country invited to the NBA predraft camp.

The next and final stop before CSU would be serving as an assistant coach at Miami. In his one season at the school, the Hurricanes finished 16-13, which was good enough for a sixth place finish in the ACC and an invitation to the NIT. Radebaugh served as the position coach for Guillermo Diaz, who was second-team all-ACC, and Robert Hite, who earned Honorable Mention all-ACC honors. Both Diaz and Hite went on to play in the NBA.

A native of Lincolnton, North Carolina, Radebaugh received his master of arts degree in physical education from the University of South Carolina in 1996 and earned his bachelor of science degree in business administration at East Tennessee State.

Radebaugh and his wife, Hope, have three children: Anna (18), Reid (13) and Sophia (12).

BUCCANEERS HEAD TO CENTENNIAL STATE FOR SHOWDOWN WITH AIR FORCE

Charleston Southern takes a 1,707-mile trip to Colorado Springs, Colo. to play **AIR FORCE**, Saturday at 9 pm. The trip is the longest of the season for the Buccaneers, and their only game west of the Mississippi River in 2009-10.

The Falcons are 1-1 after a victory over Dickinson State, 95-77, on November 20 and a loss to Northern Colorado, 70-46, a day later. Forward Evan Washington has a team-high 15.3 ppg for the Falcons early in the season.

HONORED TO FACE THE AIR FORCE ACADEMY

Sophomore forward Kelvin Martin echoed the thoughts of the Charleston Southern basketball program when he spoke about the opportunity to face Air Force after Monday night's win. "I have tons of respect for anyone that goes into the military, so I'm really looking forward to (Saturday)," Martin said. "It's going to be a great game."

LAST MEETING • AIR FORCE 67, CSU 46 • DECEMBER 20, 2003

CSU lost to Air Force in their only previous meeting, 67-46, on December 20, 2003. Kurtis Rice led the Buccaneer effort with 17 points in the loss. CSU scored just ten first half points in the game. Antoine Hood had 14 points to lead the way for Air Force.

LAST TIME OUT • CSU 99, TRINITY 50 • MONDAY

Four Bucs scored in double-figures as Charleston Southern hammered Trinity College of Florida, 99-50, Monday night at Buccaneer Field House. **JEREMY SEXTON** had the best night of his young career, scoring 17 points, dishing seven assists and pulling down six rebounds. Martin added 14 points and five assists, while Austin Johnson and Kenny Mitchell scored ten each.



Petrie Addison scored 26 of Trinity's 50 points. The Tigers turned the ball over 26 times.

DROPPIN' DIMES RIGHT AND LEFT

Charleston Southern handed out a season-high 31 assists against Trinity and turned the ball over just 12 times. The Buccaneers came up just six assists short of the school record for assists, 37, which was set on January 19, 1984 against Edward Waters. Sexton's seven led the way, while Jamarco Warren dished six, Kelvin Martin five and Jo'el Lamb four.

JOHNSON ROUNDS INTO FORM

After going scoreless in CSU's first three games, **AUSTIN JOHNSON** scored ten points Monday night against Trinity. The junior played 13 minutes against the Tigers, one more than he had played in the first three games combined. Johnson was 4-7 from the floor and 2-4 from downtown.



JUST ONE MORE POINT

Charleston Southern finished just one point shy of 100 against Trinity. The Bucs scored in triple digits twice last year, in a 107-78 win over Toccoa Falls and a 101-49 win over Covenant College. The Bucs have hit triple digits five times in the Radebaugh era, all victories. None of the five games have come against NCAA opponents.

GOODS AND BLACKMON DOMINATE THE PAINT, PART III

Once again, senior centers Billy Blackmon and Quinton Goods dominated the opposing post players with suffocating defense. The Trinity forwards scored just four combined points against Charleston Southern, and as a team the Tigers scored just 12 points in the paint. Blackmon recorded one of CSU's five blocked shots in the game.

LOW NIGHT FOR JAMARCO

Warren scored a season-low nine points against Trinity after going 3-9 from three-point range. The junior did hand out six assists and collect five rebounds in the win.

THEIR TIME TO SHINE

Several Buccaneer reserves got an opportunity to shine against Trinity. Freshmen Patrick Shaughnessy

and Theron Stephens each scored their first collegiate field goals, while senior transfer Sean Sweeney collected two rebounds, a blocked shot, and a steal. Lamb also got his first significant action of the season, scoring four points.

DEFENSIVE LOCKDOWN

Over their last five halves of basketball, the CSU defense had held their opponents to a paltry 34.2% shooting clip. Trinity shot just 37.9% from the floor on Monday night. With Radebaugh at the helm, the Bucs are 20-5 when opponents shoot less than 40% from the floor.

RADEBAUGH KNOWS BEST

Here's what CSU Head Coach **BARCLAY RADEBAUGH** said after his team's win over Trinity on Monday:

On the focus of his team during an easy win:

"We saw what we wanted to see for the first couple of minutes, then we had a lull, but our players corrected it themselves in the second half. I could sense an emotional let down, because we've played three very emotional games. I could see yesterday (during practice) that we weren't as emotionally ready to go as we needed to be."

On the improvements the team made at the half:

"At halftime, I told our players that this is their team. The way you're going to be remembered is up to you. I told them that we needed to correct our mistakes, because they weren't doing anything they wouldn't guard, and we ended up with a very productive second half."

On the good job his team did sharing the basketball:

"It's a mentality of sharing the ball. We want to be mentally tough, physically tough, play great defense and share the ball. We could have taken any shot we wanted to, but I told our guys to work for a great shot, and they've bought into that this season."

On trying to find a solid rotation of players:

"We did a lot of good things tonight, but we are still a work in progress. With so many new players, we are still trying to find our rotation a little bit and some guys are learning on the go. Again, the key for us is defensive intensity for 40 minutes. We didn't have that tonight, but we're working on it."

BUCS ARE THE BEST FROM DOWNTOWN

Led by the efforts of Warren and Tankelewicz, Charleston Southern leads the Big South in three-point field goal percentage through games played on November 22. CSU has stroked 19-of-40 trifectas

through three games, good for a 47.5% clip.

WARREN CLOSES IN ON CAREER MARKS

With each passing game, Warren is inching closer to several personal milestones. He enters the Trinity game with 986 career points, just 14 away from scoring 1,000 for his collegiate career. He has also hit eight three-point baskets on the season, giving him 183 for his CSU career. That's just 51 behind all-time CSU leader Brent Larrick, who donned the Blue and Gold from 1993-97. Warren has averaged 2.92 trifectas per game during his collegiate career. At that pace, he would surpass Larrick on February 4 at the Buc Dome against UNC Asheville.

SPOTLIGHT ON AIR FORCE

The Falcons are 2-1, with wins over Western State and Dickinson State and a loss to Northern Colorado. Junior guard Evan Washington leads the team with 15.3 ppg through three contests, while 6'8" center Grant Parker is averaging 14.0 ppg. The Falcons have struggled from three-point range this season, knocking down just 24.1% of their three-point shots. Air Force's next opponent is North Carolina Central next Wednesday night.

LOOKING BACK AT STETSON

Jamarco Warren scored 16 points while Kelvin Martin scored 15 and added ten rebounds in an 80-64 win over Stetson on November 21. The Buccaneers trailed, 43-40, with 14:01 remaining but finished the game on a 40-21 run. CSU held the Hatters to just 31.9% shooting from the floor.

LOOKING AHEAD TO TOCCOA FALLS

The Eagles of **TOCCOA FALLS COLLEGE** are 4-3 and on a two-game winning streak after victories over Piedmont College, 66-55 on November 19, and Crown College, 71-57 on November 21.



Last season, the Bucs ran over the Eagles, 107-78, on November 22, 2008. Warren scored 28 points in the win, while Martin had 15 points and 15 rebounds.

BUCS SIGN KENNEDY IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Charleston Southern signed guard Matt Kennedy during the 2009 early signing period. Kennedy, a 6'3" guard from West Ashley High School in Charleston, is the #279-ranked shooting guard in the country according to the ESPNU recruiting service. "Matt is without a doubt one of the best players in the state of South Carolina," Coach Radebaugh said of the new signee. "He can really shoot the basketball, has great size for a guard and is extremely competitive."

PARAKHOUSKI, SMITH EARN BSC WEEKLY HONORS

Radford senior center Artsiom Parakhouski has been named the Big South Conference Choice Hotels Men's Basketball Player of the Week, while Radford guard Blake Smith repeats as The Crons Brand Freshman of the Week for games.

Parakhouski averaged 27.0 points and 15.5 rebounds in two games last week. He also blocked seven shots, recorded four assists and had two steals. Against Lynchburg College, Parakhouski charted 30 points and 17 rebounds. Four days later at No. 8 Duke, he collected his 20th career double-double with 23 points and 14 rebounds against the Blue Devils.

Smith averaged 10.5 points, 4.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.0 block in his two appearances last week. In Radford's win over Lynchburg College, Smith recorded 10 points and dished out a season-high four assists. He followed that performance with 11 points, six rebounds, two assists and

MEDIA INFORMATION

CREDENTIALS

Press row and sideline credentials will be given to accredited working media only. All requests must be mailed or faxed to the Charleston Southern Office of Sports Information no later than two days before the game. Requests from media covering visiting schools can be made through that school's sports information director. Requests for photographer passes should be made no later than the day before the game.

MEDIA SERVICES

All working media will be supplied with game notes (including up-to-date statistics), media guides of both teams (whenever possible), and any other information needed in their coverage of the game. A statistics summary, including team and individual stats, will be available at halftime; play-by-play is available by request. Following the game, a complete statistical book (including team and individual statistics and play-by-play) will be made available for media by the sports information staff. Fax service is available upon request from the sports information office. Two telephone lines will be available for use following the game in the sports information office.

Each radio station broadcasting the game will have two reserved seats on press row and one telephone line. Please refer to the game contract if a fee is to be paid to CSU for use of the phone lines. Extra phone and communication lines are the responsibility of the broadcast entity.

INTERVIEWS

Postgame: Immediately following the game there will be a 10-minute cooling off period during which Coach Radebaugh will speak to the team. Radebaugh and the players will then be available to conduct interviews for both print and electronic media on the court. **The CSU Sports Network radio broadcast will receive priority for postgame interviews for Radebaugh and players.** Please inform a member of the sports information staff of the players you wish to interview after the game.. Interviews with visiting coaches and players will be arranged by the visiting sports information director.

Practice Days: Coach Radebaugh will be available to speak to the media from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays. Players will also be available to speak to the media on weekdays except game days, but priority will be given to their class and practice schedule. All interviews with players must be arranged by the media relations office. Daily practices are open to the media only by request. Please call the sports information office to verify practice time and player availability. Radebaugh will be available to speak to the media after practice. The head coach does reserve the right to close certain practice sessions.

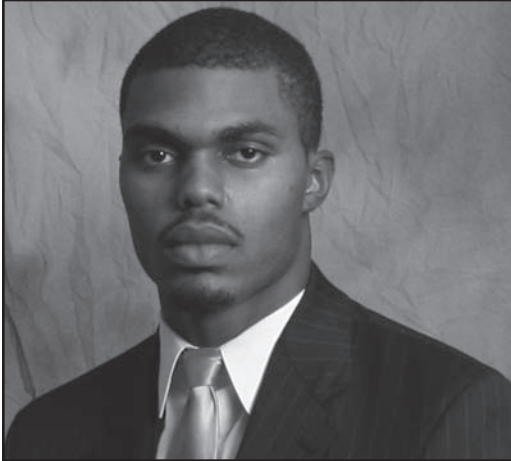

COLLEGE PARK, Md. – Charleston Southern tipped off the 09-10 season against an ACC member in the Maryland Terrapins Friday, at the Comcast Center, but CSU was outmatched in an 89-51 loss. The Bucs struggled with a 29 percent shooting effort from the field to go along with 22 turnovers, despite shooting 43 percent from behind the arc. It was the first game of the season for both squads, with CSU starting 0-1 and Maryland taking a 1-0 record.

Jamarco Warren showed why he was a Big South Preseason All-Conference selection, tallying a team high 14 points on 4-9 shooting, including a pair of triples. Kelvin Martin started his sophomore campaign off with eight points and nine boards, while Stanley Honorat also contributed eight points off the bench.

CSU did manage to hold Preseason All-ACC selection Greivis Vasquez to nine points on 3-14 shooting. Five other Terps finished in double figures however, led by Landon Milbourne with 16 points. CSU played tough in first half, with Warren scoring 12 of his 14 points in the first 20 minutes. The Bucs also kept the turnover margin to just two before the intermission, trailing 37-25 at the break.

The Maryland press was more aggressive to start the second half, as the Terps used some Buccaneer miscues in a 14-5 run out of the gate. Maryland extended their lead to 51-30 at that point and continued to roll out to a 59-32 score.

The victory improved Maryland's record at the Comcast Center to 100-20 since the building opened in 2002.

CHARLESTON, S.C. – Jamarco Warren came up with a game winning floater that sailed through the net with 1.2 seconds remaining on the clock, making Charleston Southern 61-60 winners over The Citadel Bulldogs, Tuesday at McAlister Fieldhouse. The Bucs took back a win over the cross-town rival, after losses in the past two seasons, making the series 3-2 in favor of CSU during the Barclay Radebaugh era. CSU improved to 1-1 on the young season while The Citadel dropped to 1-1.

Warren played just seven minutes in the first half due to foul trouble, but made several clutch shots in the second half, including the game-winner. He finished with 13 points on 6-9 shooting. Kelvin Martin had a great game for the Bucs, recording a double-double with 15 points on 6-10 shooting to go along with a game high 10 rebounds.

Trailing 39-33 at the intermission, CSU made some adjustments and turned up their defensive pressure in the second half, which proved to be the difference. After shooting 50% in the opening 20 minutes, the Bucs held the Bulldogs to just 32% shooting in the second frame.

An entertaining back and forth contest was played out in the second half; complete with eight ties and 10 lead changes for the game. The Citadel held a 58-55 advantage with 4:09 on the clock, but the Buccaneer deficit was just one with under a minute to play. After another defensive stop, CSU advanced the ball across half court to call a timeout with 25 seconds left to play, down 60-59.

The Bucs had a couple looks at the basket, but a broken play ended with the ball in Warren's hands. His off balance shot in the paint put CSU on top for good with just 1.2 seconds remaining. Martin then intercepted a full court pass and was fouled with 0.3 to play sealing the win for the Bucs.

Cameron Wells carried The Citadel, scoring a game high 23 points on 10-16 shooting. Kenny Mitchell tallied his first collegiate points in the game for CSU, scoring nine points and pulling down seven rebounds. Zimmy Nwogbo also chipped in with seven points and eight boards off the bench.

CHARLESTON, S.C. – Freshman Tom Tankelewicz came off the bench to stroke four threes en route to 14 points, leading Charleston Southern to an 80-64 win over the Stetson Hatters, Saturday at CSU Field House. The Bucs' bench combined for 41 points, while also shooting better than 50% from the field as a team.

Jamarco Warren had a team high 16 points on 4-10 shooting, to go along with a game high five assists. Kelvin Martin came off the bench to tally 15 points and 10 boards for the second consecutive game, while also recording four assists, four blocks and three steals. CSU shot 52% for the game and 53% from behind the arc. For the Hatters, it was A.J. Smith who led the way with a game high 23 points.

CSU surrendered the first basket of the game, but quickly responded with 10 unanswered, forcing a Stetson timeout. Both teams traded points, but a Quinton Goods free throw gave CSU their biggest lead of the half at 31-18 with 2:54 on the clock. Stetson ended the half on a good note however, drawing a shooting foul at the buzzer to make it a 32-22 score at the intermission. CSU's defense was the story in the opening 20 minutes, tallying seven blocks, four steals and holding the Hatters to just 23% shooting.

Carrying over some momentum into the second half, Stetson was firing on all cylinders, using an 11-2 run to pull within one at 34-33, three minutes into the half. A long range three from Mark Lohuis completed the run and forced a Buccaneer timeout. The Hatters took their first lead since the opening bucket, with a 37-36 score, thanks to a Ridge Graham finish at the rim. Tankelewicz answered in the following possession, knocking down his second trey of the night to put CSU on top.

CSU also used the bonus to their advantage, drawing 10 team fouls on Stetson with over eight minutes to play. Despite missing a few free throws, the Bucs went up 70-59 on another Tankelewicz three, with 3:42 remaining in the game. CSU managed to hit some free throws down the stretch, working the clock and finishing strong with an 80-64 final score.

CHARLESTON, S.C. – Charleston Southern won in a 99-50 rout over the Trinity College Tigers, Monday at the CSU Field House. The Bucs registered points from 13 different players in the process, while shooting 47% as a team. CSU improved to 3-1 on the season while Trinity fell to 1-4.

Freshman Jeremy Sexton led a cast of four players in double-figures, hitting five threes for a team high 17 points, while handing out a game best seven assists. For the Tigers it was Petrie Addison who led all players with 26 points on 10-19 shooting.

Trinity took their only lead of the game with a 2-1 score to start the game, but CSU responded with a 14-4 run, including four dunks from Martin in the process. The Bucs continued to pour it on, making it 12 unanswered points, thanks to a Billy Blackmon dunk which made it 24-6 at the 12:56 mark.

The Tigers managed a few strong finishes at the basket, but it was all CSU in the first half. The Bucs went up by as many as 28 in the opening frame, taking a 38-10 lead with 7:05 on the clock. Addison managed 16 first half points for Trinity, keeping the game from getting out of hand, but a Warren three at the buzzer made it a 49-30 score at the intermission.

The Bucs came out of the gate with a 7-0 burst in the second half. Martin threw down a windmill dunk, followed by a Warren, Kenny Mitchell alley-oop connection, that made it 56-30, a minute into the half.

CSU steadily increased their advantage, going up 69-35 on a Sexton mid-ranged jumper with 14:18 on the clock. Another 10-0 run, capped off by a Blackmon layup brought the score to 84-39 with 6:40 remaining in the game. The Bucs got contributions from several bench players, outscoring Trinity 50-20 in the final 20 minutes, for the eventual 99-50 finish. CSU forced 26 turnovers, dished out 31 assists on 42 field goals and controlled the rebounding margin 50-37
